#### Section 2.1.5 - Schools Funding Formula options

Merton proposes to replicate and maximise as many of the NFF factors as is possible to balance within the grant envelope. It aims to aligns the LA with the NFF before we are compelled to do so.

#### **Schools Forum comments:**

CL talked through the factors (listed below) and Schools Forum suggested adding these to the consultation document and adding language to say this approach is broadly consistent with what has been taken in previous years. Schools Forum also suggested adding some context to explain how these factors impact the numbers. For example schools which have a higher level of deprivation or a lower level of attainment, however given the lack of information we have on the factors for 2025/26 this would be difficult to do in a way that adds meaning to schools being consulted. Agreed the question would be rephrased to say we propose broadly sticking with the same principles as 24/25 to largely replicate the NFF.

#### Section - 2.2 MFG percentage

The MFG in 2025/26 must be set at between -0.5% and 0%. Merton propose to maximise this at 0% as far as possible, though this cannot be confirmed until it can be considered alongside the other NFF values which are yet to be released.

#### **Schools Forum comments:**

Schools Forum noted that in previous years the MFG percentage has been set above 0%. In 2025/26 the DfE have instructed this must be set at between -0.5% and 0%. Schools Forum discussed the rise in NI and the support that has been offered to public

services, although we are still awaiting confirmation.

#### Section 2.3 - De-delegation

#### **Schools Forum comments:**

Schools Forum discussed Option A, B, and C in detail and following discussion agreed to give 2 options for Attain, staying at 100k or reducing to 58k. This would also reflect the options for School Improvement, which would have two options – increasing by £42k; or by £100k (with £42k potentially being offset by a reduction in the de-delegated amount for Attain). Schools Forum discussed Attain funding, per pupil amounts and Schools Forum suggested to add to this question that these are absolute numbers and the Catholic Schools moving to and academy status and the impact this will have on pupil numbers, and therefore the per pupil funding.

Schools Forum discussed leading with outcomes rather then just the numbers to help provide more understanding to this question and get a more meaningful response. Schools Forum discussed Schools in Deficit Budgets and the impact of single form entry schools and managing place planning strategy.

#### Section 2.4 - Education Services for maintained schools

For 2025/26 Merton proposes to keep the amount static at £650k (£629k from the schools block and £21k from high needs block) retained to fund services previously funded by the Education Services Grant (ESG) (for maintained schools only).

#### **Schools Forum comments:**

Schools Forum suggested adding a line noting falling roles due to academisation which will result in an increase by pupil amount. Broadly speaking each school on average will contribute more.

Schools Forum was asked to note as we go forward whilst rolls continue to fall and more Catholic schools join the Catholic Academy Trust we will be looking at the number we ask to de delegate.

#### Section 2.5 - Growth/Falling Rolls

For 2025/26 Merton proposes to support schools with growth/falling rolls and earmark (retain) from schools block £300,000 in financial support to schools with growth (classes) or at the end of the financial year, distribute the £300,000 to schools with fallings rolls as in previous years.

#### **Schools Forum comments:**

Schools Forum suggested to make it clearer that the majority of this funding is going to falling rolls. This fund also supports schools that are dropping from two year to one year entries to support with restructuring. To be eligible for support through Falling Rolls schools need to be good or better. *Post Meeting Note: EK has been reviewed and has found this is no longer the case. EK has clarified and updated the consultation document.* 

CL explained the DfE changed the criteria last year for falling rolls. Prior to last year there was guidance and we could set our own criteria based on some the suggested criteria. To award falling rolls to a school it has to now satisfy SCAP (school capacity) data and whether those school places are going to be required in future years. This needs to explored in more detail and further clarity added to the consultation document, as it will mean that not all schools with falling rolls will be eligible for this funding.

#### Section 2.6 - Transfer between blocks

For 2025/26 Merton proposes to maintain the transfer from the Schools Block to the High Needs Block. This is 0.5% of schools block (estimated to be c.£800k but the final figure will depend on final allocations) and will be used to continue to fund the increase in place numbers at special schools and growth in top-up (banding) fees.

In support of the DSG Recovery Plan and Safety Valve Agreement a proposal to transfer an additional £500k cash (one year) from the Schools Block to the High Needs Block in support of the deficit recovery plan and working in conjunction with the DfE on the Safety Valve Programme. This would be subject to Safety Valve Team and Secretary of State (SOS) approval.

#### **Schools Forum comments:**

Schools Forum discussed these proposals noting the support to Special Schools, HNB and impact on Academy Schools.

# Section 5.1.4 - High Needs Block - Targeted support to schools with high SEN pupil numbers

Merton is proposing to continue to provide additional funding outside the main funding formula for mainstream schools and academies. The proposal is to allocate an additional £350,000 for when mainstream schools have more than the average number of EHCP pupils. Distribution will be based on a percentage allocation.

## **Early Years Block update**

LB explained the decision to defer the early years block consultation until information is confirmed and shared from the DfE. The childcare expansion is continuing to roll out, second phase of the reform only started in September so difficult to predict numbers at this stage.

#### 4 AOB – All

#### **DSG Subgroup Update**

EF confirmed there was no meeting but provided a verbal update. The in year deficit is growing. The DfE are aware and have acknowledged all the actions we are doing to keep on track.

EF provided an update on the rising number of EHCPs and the impact on Local Authority. The new Government has acknowledged the SEN system is broken and the uplift next year will be around 6% - 10% rather than the 2% this year.
