

# Proposed Controlled Parking Zone (CPZ)

## RB CPZ – Morden Road area

Dear Resident / Business

The purpose of this leaflet is to let you know of the outcome of the informal consultation carried out between 22 January and 24 February 2024 on the proposals to introduce Controlled Parking Zone (CPZ) RB to include Deer Park Gardens, Heatherdene Close, Morden Garden and Morden Road between London Road and Deer Park Gardens.

### RB CPZ CONSULTATION RESULTS

The consultation resulted in 53 online responses. After removing duplicate/multiple returns, the overall response rate is 16%.

In terms of the question, do you support a CPZ in your road, of the 53 who responded, 28% support a CPZ, compared to 64% who do not and 8% who were unsure/no reply.

In response to the question, would you be in favour of a CPZ in your Road if the neighbouring road(s) or part of your road were included in a CPZ, of the 53 who responded, 28% support a CPZ, compared to 64% who do not and 8% who were unsure/no reply.

With regards to days of operation, residents were asked which days of operation they would prefer should the CPZ be introduced in their road, of the 53 who responded, 75% prefer Mon - Friday, 8% prefer Monday – Saturday, 13% prefer Monday to Sunday and 4% who were unsure/no reply.

With regards to hours of operation, residents were also asked which hours of operation they would prefer should the CPZ be introduced in their road. Of the 53 who responded 28% of respondents prefer 8.30am to 6.30pm, while 62% prefer 11am to 3pm and 8% prefer 10am to 4pm and 4% who are unsure/no reply.

The results of the consultation along with officers' recommendations were presented in a report to the Cabinet Member for Transport on the 25 April 2024.

Based on responses that have been received, it has been agreed to:

- abandon the CPZ element of the proposals of RB CPZ.
- proceed with a statutory consultation of the relevant Traffic Management Orders (TMOs) and the implementation of the 'At any time' waiting restrictions within the proposed zone. As shown in the attached plan.
- carry out a statutory to introduce restricted free parking spaces in Morden Road, between London Road and Deer Park Gardens operating Monday to Friday between 8am and 6pm, with Max stay 1 hour with no return within 2 hours. As shown in the attached plan.

## WHAT HAPPENS NEXT

A Notice of the Council's intention to introduce the above measures will be published in a local newspaper (Wimbledon and Wandsworth Times) and the London Gazette and posted on lamp columns in the vicinity. Representations against the proposals described in this Notice must be made in writing or email [trafficandhighways@merton.gov.uk](mailto:trafficandhighways@merton.gov.uk) by no later than **16 August 2024** quoting reference **ES/RB**. Objections must relate only to the elements of the scheme that are subject to this statutory consultation.

A copy of the proposed Traffic Management Orders (TMOs), a plan identifying the areas affected by the proposals and the Council's Statement of Reasons can be inspected at Merton Link, Merton Civic Centre, London Road, Morden, Surrey, SM4 5DX during the Council's normal office hours Monday to Friday, 9am to 5pm. 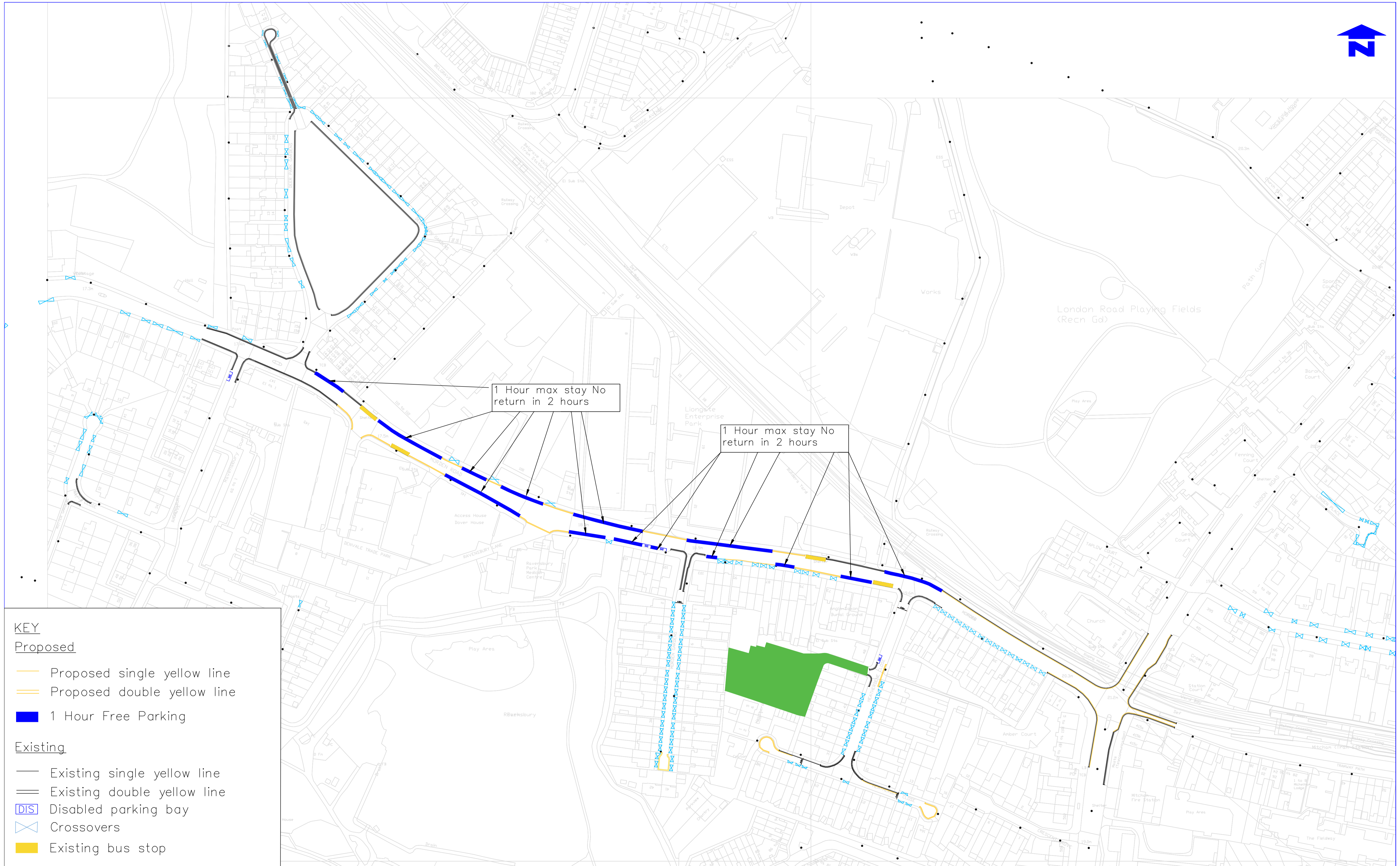
